All FoMA members and their guests are cordially invited to attend this traditional Greek celebration featuring the cutting of the Vasilopitta Cake to bless the New Year.


Named after the Father of the Church Basil the Great (4th c.), the Vasilopitta Cake is linked to a legend that Saint Basil, Bishop of Caesarea, used to bake a huge bread containing gold coins and jewellery to distribute to the poor. Its cutting, on New Year's Day, signifies hope for a prosperous year while the coin (flouri), that is hidden inside it, represents the original valuables that St Basil used to hide in the bread that he was distributing to the poor in his diocese.

Please join us for this highly enjoyable annual social event with wine, soft drinks, traditional Greek pastries and cake.
